Why convene this seminar?

VISTA argues that a robust VET sector is crucial to the development of any national economy and so it follows that the VET professional community in East Timor will be instrumental in driving economic development and social recovery.

East Timor has a VET sector but it is fragmented - and was so, even before the current turmoil. A diverse range base level VET is being delivered by NGOs, churches, local training centres and, of course, a number of Victorian VET sector initiatives.

What we need to know and talk about....

Many VET professionals in Australia are keen to contribute our expertise and other assistance to East Timor but few of us actually understand what the VET sector there actually looks like or how it operates. VET in East Timor is not as we might imagine – but it does exist and it will grow with our support.

There are many ways in which VET professionals in Australia may contribute - as individuals, within departments, networks, whole organisations etc.

BUT the difficulty is that East Timor has to be ready to absorb such support which must be both timely and targeted.

Our VET support to East Timor has to be informed and savvy in order to be effective.
