2017 marks 15 years of independence in Timor-Leste after 24 years of Indonesian occupation. Student Conservators for Timor-Leste (SCTL) and the Grimwade Centre for Cultural Materials Conservation (GCCMC) invite you to participate in a symposium to celebrate 15 years since independence. This event will comprise of a one day symposium, coinciding with an art exhibition to be held at The Good Room, home of The Foundling Archive. The exhibition will run from 27 October to 3 November 2017, focussing on **Timor-Leste: Then and Now**, including an official opening and public programs.

SCTL invites papers and posters that look broadly at the cultural heritage of Timor-Leste.

The program will consist of invited speakers, peer-reviewed paper and poster presentations as well as an exhibition displaying recent works by Timor-Leste artists, and electronic display of conservation work that has been undertaken by students of the Grimwade Centre on Timor-Leste newspapers from 1975.

SCTL is a graduate organisation at the University of Melbourne supporting the conservation and safeguarding of Timor-Leste's cultural heritage. The organisation is an initiative that follows the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) by the University of Melbourne and Universidade Nacional Timor Lorosa'e (UNTL) in September 2011. SCTL aims to continue to work within the frame for the advancement of Timor-Leste's cultural heritage conservation.
