ABOUT THE PROJECT

We are seeking suitable candidates to undertake PhD research study to (i) explore and map the pathways by which mangrove forests contribute to nutritional security in rural coastal communities of Indonesia; (ii) understand the gendered aspects of this nutritional security; and, (iii) compare nutritional security across different landscape mosaics, leading to identification of thresholds and recommendations of mangrove agro-ecosystem ratios.

The PhD candidate will be engaged with an international project team and local partners, as well as academic supervisors and research for development experts (through partnership with <u>CIFOR</u>). This project is linked to CDU/ Blue Forests Indonesia-Mangrove Management 2019-2024 Program.
