"Keepers of the Flame: The Cultural Legacy of Three Hawaiian Women is a tribute to three Hawaiian women whose lives spanned the 19th and 20th centuries: Hawaiian historian and author, Mary Kawena Pukui; dancer and chanter, 'Iolani Luahine; and kumu hula and teacher, Edith Kanaka'ole. This story reveals the power of their commitment to Hawaiian culture and values and the ways their influence is still felt today."
