The Pacific Branch of the Pacific Arts Association is offering registration for its 2015 conference, to be held at the Fa'onelua Conference Centre in Nuku'alofa, Tonga from 28 September to 4 October, 2015.

Recent archaeological investigations have confirmed what we already knew-- that there was widespread trade among islands and cultures across the pacific well in advance of the European arrival. The theme of this conference offers a myriad of investigations into the role/s art has played in the exchange of objects, peoples, technologies, and ideologies in the pre-historic, historic, or modern Pacific. It is not limited to 'physical' exchanges, but also addresses complex social, economic and political arrangements/interactions between interconnected systems, structures and peoples. Among others, we seek to enhance our understanding of how art moved across time and through communities, why some exchanges were more successful than others and how geography, technology, or localized social structures influenced artistic function, meaning or traditions.

The Conference structure will include but is not limited to, paper presentations, panel exchanges, small group discussions, an exhibition, and excursions to local monuments. Film and multi-media experiences would be welcomed as well as performative or other Innovative events dealing with the theme of trade and interaction.

We invite proposals from researchers and scholars, curators and artists to engage with and challenge this broad theme. Ideally, participants will be open to sharing their knowledge and experiences with other conference attendees building networks for ongoing intellectual and social exchange.

"Significant Exchange: Eighteenth Century Tongan Arts and their Legacies" Keynote Address by Phyllis S. Herda Anthropology, University of Auckland Auckland, Aotearoa/New Zealand

Phyllis Herda has always worked across the traditional disciplines of Anthropology, Pacific History and Gender Studies. She began working in Tonga in 1982 and continues to research, write and teach on Tongan ethnography, oral tradition and history; gender, disease and colonialism in Polynesia as well as Polynesian textiles, traditional and contemporary. She has taught Pacific History at Victoria University and is currently a Senior Lecturer in Anthropology and Women's Studies at the University of Auckland. She gained a BA at the University of Arizona, an MA degree in Anthropology at the University of Auckland and completed a PhD in Pacific History at the Australian National University.

From Australia-Fly directly to Tonga from Sydney. There are two flights a week from Sydney

Visa Requirements: Holders of passports from Australia, New Zealand, USA and most Pacific islands do not require a visa to enter Tonga, but should have an return ticket to show immigration. <u>Tour of the Island:</u>

On the half day tour of the island we will visit the village of Lapaha with the langi tombs, a lapita-era settlement area (TBC), the Ha'amonga a Maui and the Blowholes.

Food and Drink:

Cafeteria, lunch counter, luncheonette, lunchroom, snack bar, greasy spoon, hash house, chophouse, steak house, pizzeria, coffeehouse, coffee shop, estaminet, teahouse, tearoom, tea shop... call it what you will, enjoy a light meal at a Tongan cafe. performance at Oholei Beach Resort. This is NOT to be missed! Some of the traditional Tongan dishes are lobster and fish, octopus, steamed pork, suckling pig, and tropical fruits. Some of the most well liked and mouth watering dishes are devilled clams, feke consisting of squid or grilled octopus in coconut sauce, lobster, meat and onions marinated in coconut milk and baked in taro leaves, 'ota or raw fish marinated in lemon juice, 'ufi or large white yam, taro, tropical fruits and all types of salads. A typical feast includes chicken, crayfish, octopus, pork and vegetables steamed in an umu, suckling pig, and several varieties of tropical fruits. Money:

ATMs are outside most banks, and they accept most major credit cards. There are exchanges and Westpac, ANZ and MBf have locations in Nuku'alofa. An exchange will be open upon arrival at the airport. Credit cards are accepted by hotels, restaurants, big shops and airline offices in Nuku'alofa but not at budget places, such as cafes or guest houses. Best to have cash available.

The Tongan dollar is the Pa'anga (TOP) and comes in \$1, \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50 and \$100 dollar denominations.

Transport:

Airport Transfers: Book an airport transfer with your accommodation.

Around Town: Taxis are readily available and are reasonable – the most convenient way to get around besides walking. Most everything is walking distance in Nuku'alofa. There are buses to outer villages at the bus station but it is recommended that you stay in town rather than in the outer areas as there is little available after hours and times can be a bit erratic. Car rental companies are at the airport and in town. Check trip advisor.
