AtollGame: a Companion Modelling Experience in the Pacific

Abstract:

The low-lying coral atoll of Tarawa (Republic of Kiribati) is heavily dependent on groundwater for freshwater supplies. Conflicts resulting from Government policies concerning water and land tenure, along with increasing water consumption and levels of human waste (leading to groundwater contamination) are major issues at stake that threaten the sustainability of the water system. Our project aims at providing the relevant information to the local actors, including institutional and local community representatives in order to facilitate the dialogue and devise together sustainable and equitable water management practices. Multi-Agent Based Simulations (MABS) coupled with a Role-Playing Game have been implemented to fulfil this aim. They have the potential to greatly reduce conflict over natural resource management and resource allocation.

Anne Dray is a Visiting Fellow at RMAP. Her current research is focused on developing new negotiation support tools for policy makers based on agent-based modelling and role playing games to help facilitate sustainable management of natural resources.
